Introduction

The intent of this document is to publicly present evidence of events that took place at Thornton Creek Elementary school in the Spring of 2018, in which some teachers, parents, and administrators conspired through exclusive back-channel communication to remove other parents from their leadership roles at the school. We assert that the events of last spring are still relevant and informative regarding continuing discord at the school. We had been waiting for the District to conclude investigations, but after nearly a year, we feel the need to share what we know about what happened last Spring. We believe the parallels between what happened then and what is happening now will be clear. Though this is an evidence-backed document, it is not neutral. The editors of this document believe these events were highly inappropriate and unethical, and are indicative of a deeper brokenness in the culture at Thornton Creek that can and should be addressed directly. Where possible and appropriate, this document will depersonalize information to avoid singling out individuals. In the spirit of full disclosure and transparency, publicly available information is included in the appendices, and these documents do not redact personally identifying information beyond what FERPA requires.

A note on the editorial process

The editors believe the facts in this document should speak for themselves. We believe it stands on those merits. Contributing editors include Christina Ellis, Evan Briggs, and David Simonton.

Email communications excerpted here are available in the appendices.

Identifying Patterns

Retaliation and scapegoating

We believe the evidence supports our conclusion that a small group of teachers and parents conspired to remove Evan and Christina from their leadership roles, and that parents were deliberately recruited for the express purpose of forcing an election, while the community was being led to believe the election came about organically. (Though electoral processes are specified in Site Council bylaws, there had not been an election in more than a decade.)

From an April 25 email from one parent to a group of five teachers:

"A group of us are beginning to think about how to proceed with a call for nominations for new site council leadership. After talking with Kristin yesterday, I think the only way out of this is for both of them to be out of leadership ASAP, which likely will have to be the end of this year, but could be immediately.

I don't yet know how to do this without starting an all out war between those of us who see what trouble Christina is causing and those who think she's cherry pie and is the victim in this situation "having been through a lot." We really cannot accuse her of the things we believe to be true."

Then, from the same email thread on April 25, a teacher wrote:

"I recommend that we take a look at the bylaws that allows for elections in June. I think it makes sense to propose new leadership nominees and go from there?" From a May 6 email from one parent to a small group of parents and staff:SS

"The only reason folks would make a stink about not following bylaws is because the motive is clear... to get E and C out of office. I'm concerned that we are not facing this problem head on, with honesty. I wish teachers could just come out and say that they would like for them to step down. I would advocate for parents to do this too but we are just not unified in this way so that wouldn't work."

Later in that same email:

"As far as the question of what can teachers do to support parents who are advocating moving on with a new slate... good question. I think the best thing any of us can do right now is be honest. We need to stop dancing around the issues and we need to discuss them. We don't have to do it in an unkind way but we must address the elephant which is all the bad feelings between teachers and the current chair/vice. The parents who think they should go feel that way because of how the teachers feel. We are supporting you and what you want. We agree with you but if you were telling us they were fabulous, we wouldn't be trying to stage a coup!!!

I guess the question is... what if we are unsuccessful? Can we live with the two of them for another year? And what then if Christina wants to become chair? Which is not written in the bylaws but has certainly been the unofficial expectation since before I became chair. How hard are we fighting this?"

From the same thread, but written by a different parent the next day:

"I had volunteered to be the fall-guy tomorrow night by raising the topic of needing to change leadership, regardless of bylaws. That said, it is getting harder and harder to act as if our tribe of parents is operating independently of staff influence. At some point (tomorrow night?) staff need to say if they're united in wanting change; sounds like [teacher] agrees. Then we parents can voice support of that."

The role of teachers

We believe evidence supports our conclusion that teachers directed parents on the most effective ways to go about changing Site Council leadership.

On April 25, one parent relays to another parent a suggestion given by a teacher:

"[Teacher] thinks we should just say that BLT is getting official so we think Site Council should too and thus the elections."

On May 4, in an email reply from a BLT teacher to a parent who had inquired about how to broach the topic of elections and voting at Site Council:

"Teacher perspective wise, [teacher] and I really can't be in front of any kind of unified teacher statement about wanting new leadership. Sounds like there may be new accusations leveled at us again by way of [EDS] in this regard. We're thinking perhaps a statement regarding the need

to be transparent and follow bylaws and procedures - that's what we're aiming for on staff, that's been the work of BLT, that was the goal of the staff hiring committee, and we strongly support that for site council."

On May 7, Evan met privately with a parent to confront them about parent-teacher collusion to remove her and Christina. The next morning, [teacher] sent an email to that parent:

"Our message is attached. Literally doing everything I can to fix this."

On May 8, Evan wrote to that teacher to let them know that she and Christina became aware of staff involvement in the attempt to remove them:

"So, this is awkward, but the only way we know how to address it is head on at this point. Too much time has passed with too little transparent communication.

Christina and I have received confirmation from members of the parent community that staff is behind this attempt to oust us from Site Council by trying to invoke the by-laws. While this is undoubtedly a quite unfortunate turn of events, I think it needs to be acknowledged in light of tonight's meeting. There are many members of the parent community who are also aware of this situation, and who are upset about it and feel that it is wrong. So I think delivering this statement tonight might come across as disingenuous, and further create the appearance that this is all just a big charade.

Christina and I would still like to propose a transparent, mediated conversation with staff-- but obviously that isn't going to happen before tonight. So I think it's best that we just hold off on making any declarative statements at this time, until further resolution can be reached. I am hopeful that the site council meeting can nonetheless proceed amicably and civilly."

To which the teacher replied with a denial of involvement:

"Thank you for your email. There continues to be grave misunderstandings. Staff genuinely want to move forward. We'll begin by reading the statement at the meeting tonight as agreed.

I will work with BLT to coordinate a mediated discussion per your request."

(To read the full statement that was read publicly at site council, see Appendix A: BLT Statement 1. The statement emphasizes misunderstandings and a desire to repair damaged relationships and move forward.)

Gaslighting

We believe the evidence supports our conclusion that, late in the sequence of events, parents engaged in gaslighting Evan and Christina to accuse them of the very behaviors that parents and teachers had been engaging in themselves.

On May 20, a parent emailed Evan:

"Evan, we must avoid back channel communications, as it's a violation of our school handbook's adult code of conduct (page 5). Attaching the email where it was requested by you to the

newsletter team not to publish the election process, and cc'd Helen Joung from the District & Jonathan Gasbar. Please, let's ALL re-familiarize ourselves with the code of conduct, be inclusive, and hopefully we can bring this current situation to an amicable resolution."

On May 23, a parent urged another parent to follow up with room parents regarding information about Site Council elections:

"Yes – please follow up. The chair and co-chair are actively trying NOT to follow bylaws and subvert an election. We're trying to keep the process open and transparent and the community involved but they are making it difficult (for reasons we don't understand)."

Misinformation takes on a life of its own

We believe some of the quotes above contain evidence of unspecified rumors against Christina Ellis:

"After talking with Kristin yesterday, I think the only way out of this is for both of them to be out of leadership ASAP..."

"...those of us who see what trouble Christina is causing..."

"We really cannot accuse her of the things we believe to be true."

Timeline of events

February 2, 2018: John Miner announces his retirement.

February 13, 2018: At the monthly Site Council meeting, John Miner says that he asked the district to appoint Kristin Bailey as his successor and requests that Site Council provide a letter of support on behalf of the parent group.

March 9, 2018: BLT meets to discuss principal hiring process. Evan and Christina suggest that we need to take a closer look at some race and bullying issues happening at our school, and that whomever becomes our next principal should have strong competency in these areas.

March 12, 2018: BLT/Site Council Leadership meets with Helen Joung, Executive Director of Schools, to discuss principal hiring process. Helen suggests to members of BLT that they choose Christina as one of two parents on the hiring committee because she would be able to represent underrepresented voices at TC, she has a Special Education child and is the Vice Chair of SC. Staff are resistant, but eventually agree to allow Christina to serve on the interview panel.

March 13, 2018: Site Council meeting in which principal "look-fors" are discussed and brainstormed as a community. Several parents at the meeting mention issues of race, equity and bullying as priorities.

March 19, 2018: In a meeting with Christina and Evan, [teacher] says that we shouldn't be forcing race and equity conversations at this time, and should try to hire a principal (referencing Kristin Bailey by name) who will focus on Expeditionary Learning (EL). Christina explains that it shouldn't be either/or between race and equity and EL; they can and should go hand in hand, but if forced to choose, she would always prioritize people over EL.

March 24, 2018: Principal interviews take place at central office.

March 29, 2018: Kristin Bailey sends email to all staff, Evan, Christina and [parent] announcing that she was not selected to be TC's principal. Within hours Evan and Christina are hearing from other members of the parent community that this is the fault of "Site Council leadership."

April 5, 2018: Evan meets with John Miner in his office to request his help. She says that the situation is spiraling, staff do not trust her or Christina, and they are confiding in last year's SC chairs rather than speaking with them directly. Evan tells John that he is the only one everyone trusts and she needs his help bringing everyone back together. She also tells him that staff believe, and have circulated a rumor, that Christina filed a "race complaint" against them, but she didn't. John was surprised to learn that she filed no such complaint ("She didn't?" he replied). John seems concerned and agrees to help.

April 16, 2018: TC community receives letter from SPS district office informing us that our new principal will be Jonathan Gasbar.

April 17, 2018: TC Facebook page and class email lists display alarmed parents circulating various theories about our new principal and what his selection might mean for our school. People seem very afraid this is part of a larger plan to dismantle our program. Evan emails Helen Joung to gain clarity around the district's intent, so that she might be able to quell some of the fear in the community at that evening's Site Council meeting. Helen assures Evan that the district has no plans to interrupt TC's program and asks Evan to please relay this to the community at the SC meeting that night. (Evan's email to Helen is Appendix I.)

During the SC meeting, Evan acknowledges the fears and concerns of the parent community and explains that she reached out directly to Helen for answers. This news was met with objections and skepticism from various angry staff members. John Miner remains silent despite his promises to help Evan and Christina heal divisions within the community and foster more trust between staff and SC.

April 19, 2018: Evan reaches out to Mike Starosky (SPS Chief of Schools) via email to ask for his help allaying fear within the TC community regarding the district's alleged plan to dismantle the program, since her attempt to communicate this during the previous SC meeting had been unsuccessful. (Evan's email to Mike is Appendix J.)

April 22, 2018: A parent meeting regarding the principal hiring process is held at One Church in Wedgwood. The meeting becomes contentious and heated, with competing points of view, and people leave with various perspectives on how this meeting went.

April 25, 2018: Mike Starosky sends a letter to the TC community assuring parents that the program is not in danger. (Appendix B: Starosky Email)

April 30, 2018: [Parent] approaches Evan in the morning and asks for a few minutes. She explains there's a "movement" to return to the by-laws and impose 1-year term limits on SC positions, which they hope will also generate more volunteerism. Evan had been asked to serve a 2-year term and asks [parent] if the intention is to fill vacant positions or to remove officers. [Parent] admits that it's about removing Christina, citing that people don't "feel safe" with her. When Evan inquires further [parent] repeats a false rumor that Christina has "barged into John and Kristin's offices yelling." Evan then asks

who is providing this information. [Parent] does not reply and ends the conversation. TC staff later that day circulated communications advertising non-vacant SC positions.

May 8, 2018: Evan emails [teacher] to tell her that they have learned of staff's involvement in planning the election in order to remove them (Evan and Christina) from Site Council and that therefore she thinks it would be disingenuous to read a previously planned statement of reconciliation at the Site Council meeting. Evan suggests instead that they continue efforts to plan a sit-down meeting to discuss the issues face to face. [Teacher] replies that there has been a "grave misunderstanding" and that staff "genuinely want to move forward" and will start by reading their statement at the SC meeting, which she does. (Appendix C: Grave Misunderstandings)

May 9, 2018: Evan sends an email to [teacher], John Miner, Kristin Bailey and Concie Pedroza (SPS Director of Leadership Development for Equity and Impact) asking if Concie would be willing to mediate a discussion between staff, Evan, and Christina.

May 11, 2018: Christina pulls her son out of school for the remainder of the school year, following acts of retaliation earlier in the week that followed Tuesday's Site Council meeting where teachers were unsuccessful in calling for an election. Christina's son had received two consecutive, first ever, suspensions, which was highly unusual both for the child and for TC. Christina escalated the case, and the District agreed the actions appeared to be retaliation, and his record was expunged.

May 29, 2018: Special SC meeting is held to discuss election procedures. The discussion quickly turns contentious as the community questions why they are here and why elections are being held. By way of explanation, Evan tells the community about her conversation with [parent], wherein [parent] explained that people don't "feel safe" with Christina, and wanted to remove her from her SC position. Evan explains that this behavior is consistent with patterns of institutional racism. A heated discussion ensues.

[Teacher] stands up to read another statement on behalf of all staff (only 2 weeks after having read her first statement in which she claimed staff wanted to work with SC leadership) and says staff support a change of leadership because current SC leaders make them feel "unsafe."

After the meeting, many parents express to Evan and Christina how uncomfortable they felt voicing their opinions at the meeting when it was so clear which side staff were on, for fear of that negatively impacting their relationship with their children's teacher. Many parents were also upset and offended by [teacher's] statement on behalf of all staff.

June 1, 2018: Christina requests a public letter of apology from staff for [teacher's] statement, which was offensive not only to her but also to other members of the community.

June 8, 2018: Evan and Christina jointly file an official HIB (Harassment, Intimidation, and Bullying) complaint against SPS staff. The complaint is based on staff retaliation for Evan and Christina's perceived role in the principal hiring process and Kristin Bailey not being awarded the job. (SPS central office acknowledges receipt of complaint and opens a formal investigation on June 14th which is still ongoing as of this document's compilation March 2019). Christina and her family have since left the TC community on the grounds it was a hostile environment for her family.

June 12, 2018: Last SC meeting of the year. No apology is read by staff, and no members of BLT are present. Evan and Christina read a statement recusing themselves from further involvement with the election. (Appendix E: E and C Statement)

June 22, 2018: Kristin Bailey lets the TCE community know that she is leaving TC to take a principal position in Northshore School District.

Kristin Bailey sends threatening email to Evan Briggs asking her to rescind her request for the Freedom of Information Act Request of certain staff emails. (On 6/29/18, Kristin is subject to a disciplinary action for doing this.)

Conclusions

The editors contend that:

- Some teachers, staff, and parents conspired through exclusive back channels to circulate targeted misinformation about other parents in the community in order to remove them from their leadership positions.
- Misinformation in the form of unsubstantiated rumor took on a life of its own, and was allowed to spread in the service of this campaign.
- The above behaviors resulted in a fractured community with strained relationships. Particularly problematic are the relationships between targeted families and the teachers who teach the children in those families. Christina Ellis' family was so affected they chose to leave the community because of it. Other families have withdrawn from fully participating in TC life and culture.

Recommendations:

Restorative Justice is a framework that seeks reconciliation over harms done to a community. It begins when offenders take responsibility for the harm they have inflicted and seek to repair those harms. When participants do not admit or recognize their own behavior as harmful, restorative justice is not possible. The editors of this document are skeptical the community is yet ready to embark on a process of restorative justice based on repairing past harms and a sincere commitment to do less harm in the future. We propose members of the community seriously consider the following questions:

- What behaviors drive and sustain the rumor mill?
- Is it ever appropriate for teachers to participate in information wars against families at school?
- Is it ever appropriate for parents to participate in information wars against families at school?
- Does collaborative governance encourage and reward this kind of misbehavior?
- Do teachers have adequate protections and processes (union?) to air grievances without fear of retaliation?
- Where are boundaries appropriate and helpful under our governance model, delineating a healthy balance of power between interest groups?
- What are the most (and least) effective ways to include the various lived experiences and perspectives of the heterogeneous families that comprise our community?
- How can the community work toward creating braver spaces where everyone feels empowered to engage respectfully with others who might hold a different or conflicting perspective?

Post script: What's race got to do with it?

Throughout the events of last year and continuing today, the editors of this document have heard parents and teachers express confusion, concern, or offense over the suggestion that the election involved a racial component. We do understand that anyone who is not well versed in Critical Race Theory or actively involved in antiracist study and practice will be unfamiliar with those models. In general, race studies have moved away from models in which racism is committed by individuals with conscious, malevolent intent based on racial prejudice.

Instead, contemporary models examine patterns of racism that are upheld by subconscious biases, and which are usually invisible to people who benefit from those patterns. In this way, racism is understood as an ordinary part of our social fabric, woven into our daily lives through history and culture, everpresent like a smog we all breathe. Consequently, it becomes easier to understand why we live in a society that is profoundly divided and unequal by race, yet is populated predominantly by people who do not see themselves as participating in racist patterns of behavior. Antiblack racism is especially pronounced in American culture, where whiteness has been invented in contrast to blackness. The pattern of racism called out by Evan Briggs in the 5/29/18 special Site Council meeting has been documented and studied in many work environments. It has been diagrammed on the following page.

denial of racism

The editors of this document believe the evidence supports a reasonable conclusion that this same pattern fits with Christina Ellis' experience. The evidence is as follows:

- 1. Christina Ellis' own testimony is that this matches her experience.
- 2. In the communications quoted above and in the appendices, there are several times when parents and staff have said they felt "unsafe" around Christina. "Unsafe" is commonly used as a substitute for "uncomfortable." (See DiAngelo, "What Does It Mean To Be White," Chapter 13)
- 3. Reasons offered to explain feeling threatened were often based on fabrications, like her "barging into offices and yelling," or her "filing a race complaint" against teachers.
- 4. In tense meetings where both Evan and Christina, and others too, would raise their voices, only Christina would be characterized as "yelling."

People will either find this evidence compelling or not depending on their own predispositions about how to evaluate evidence. If you find this evidence compelling enough to be troubled by it, we encourage you to further explore antiracist study and practice.

Appendix A: BLT Statement 1

I've been asked to make this statement on behalf of Thornton Creek Staff.

We'd like to begin by acknowledging how truly difficult, and at times messy, this year of change and rapid growth has been for staff and for Site Council. We'd like to extend our deep appreciation for this community of families for their ongoing support, advocacy and volunteered time. Because of your continued involvement in our school community, your children have flourished and enjoyed many wonderful events—like the Harvest Festival, the Walk-a-Thon, the Winter Bazaar...not to mention all our fabulous camping excursions, service learning ventures and expeditionary learning treks into the world. Our educational community has sustained and thrived over these many years because we prioritize relationships with each other. These relationships benefit all our students because they know they are surrounded by and supported by hundreds of caring adults who believe in them and who stand by each other.

This year, there have been missteps, communication mishaps and misunderstandings. We've done our best to organize ourselves and set each other up for success in solidarity. For example, staff devoted many hours to developing an official Building Leadership Team to represent and support our growing teaching team. We are also unifying around strengthening our expeditionary learning programs and building a robust Multi-Tiered Support System to provide instruction that meets the needs of all students. Even with all this hard, well-intentioned work our relationship with Site Council has suffered. So thank you, for sticking with us and for being willing to move forward as we continue to navigate growth and change.

Going forward, we want to repair and revitalize our relationship with Site Council. Knowing that we've endured difficulties this year, we're hoping to collectively recommit to transparent communication, recommit to established processes (like the TC Adult Code of Conduct and By-Laws) and create inclusive committees that include both parent and teacher stakeholders.

At the end of each long day, we all want the same thing for our children. We want them to be kind. We want them to be inclusive and observant. We want them to be informed and curious. We want our kids to be resilient and to positively impact their world. So, in the end, we are in this together.

Dear Thornton Creek Elementary community,

It has come to my attention that there are some in the Thornton Creek community who have raised concerns about the principal hiring and selection process, the uncertainty of what this selection may have on Thornton Creek's priorities and what the community can do to support the incoming principal, Mr. Jonathan Gasbar. First, let me reassure you that Thornton Creek as an option school with an expeditionary learning focus will continue to thrive regardless of leadership change.

In response to those that stated the principal interview process was unclear, I will be meeting with members of the Thornton Creek interview team to listen to their feedback regarding how we can improve sharing parent and community input for future principal interview teams and how we can help ensure clear, transparent processes and expectations of communities.

Seattle Public Schools (SPS) is fortunate to have a strong pool of both internal and external principal candidates who want to join our principal leadership. This can make final decisions challenging, which was certainly the case at Thornton Creek. I have personally kept Dr. Larry Nyland abreast of the interview process to ensure the process was followed and that the recommended finalists were interviewed properly.

We know that some in the community were disappointed that an external candidate was selected as Thornton Creek's next principal. Candidates were evaluated based on the quality of their responses to questions by both the site-based interview team and the final interviews by central office leadership. To disclose the content of those responses would be inappropriate and break confidentiality rules. All leaders who were interviewed met or exceeded the qualifications to lead in SPS. Mr. Gasbar was chosen on the quality of his interviews with multiple staff within SPS and exceptional professional references.

Executive Director Helen Joung, the hiring administrator, and the full Thornton Creek interview team followed district interview policies and protocols in the selection of the two finalists. Principal interview teams only make recommendations for finalists to be considered for placement by the superintendent or their designee. Ultimately, the superintendent is the one who makes all hiring decisions of principals.

Thornton Creek Elementary has become a leader in SPS for its expeditionary learning focus under the leadership of Principal John Miner. Mr. Miner, along with past and present staff, has worked with the parents of and community of Thornton Creek to create a great culture and curriculum we expect to continue. The hallmarks of Thornton Creek, such as expeditionary learning, will continue to be supported by central office leadership.

We have heard concerns from some in the community and want to clarify the following:

- There are no plans to shift away from the expeditionary learning focus.
- The district has no plans to close Thornton Creek as an option school in the northeast region or make
 it a neighborhood school by getting rid of expeditionary learning.
- There are no plans to make Thornton Creek a dual language immersion school.

I want to reassure you that our intent is not to disrupt or dismantle in any way the incredible work done by so many over the years at Thornton Creek. The selection of Principal Gasbar was with the expectation that he will build upon and preserve Thornton Creek's culture and success. He has shown great interest and respect for the existing program and is committed to continuing the thoughtful and innovative curriculum based on experiential learning.

I encourage everyone in the community to work with Principal Miner during this transition. Principal Miner has met with Executive Director Joung to discuss the transition plan, which includes a welcoming from students, staff and parents. Principal Miner has committed to supporting Principal Gasbar in his transition to getting to know the students, staff, parents and the great work of Thornton Creek. Principal Gasbar is excited to lead Thornton Creek and build upon the foundation that has been created.

I hope that we can refocus our attention on supporting our newly appointed principal for a successful school year. Thornton Creek is a highly collaborative school, and I have great confidence that all stakeholders will continue to make it a very special place in partnership with the new principal.

The community is expressing confusion to the office and staff about how to step up for positions already occupied. As a result, I've been asked as comms chair to communicate the election process, that is outlined in our Parent Group Bylaws & Standing Rules.

It isn't yours, mine, the principals' or the district's place to dictate we won't hold an election when it's clearly detailed as a process to use when more than one person is interested. If we do not follow the established bylaws and rules, it denies due process to the ~1000 Site Council members made of up of staff and parents.



I appreciate the follow up and I think we need to be really clear about what was and wasn't said. At no point did Starosky threaten anyone. He said nothing about preventing parents from expressing concerns/feedback about the actual process. Folks are more than welcome to share their thoughts about that and absolutely have that right. There is a lot of talk about this being about the process and not specifically about Jonathan, but then the conversation keeps returning to Jonathan himself and the desire to overturn the appointment. I heard one parent at the meeting Sunday night (and also a Fb comment to the same effect) suggest that continuing to inundate the Superintendent's office with demands to overturn the appointment and install Kristin might succeed, and I felt it important to convey that this is not the case

Starosky was clear that under no circumstances would Kristin be principal of our school, and that if Nyland felt the resistance to this was persistent enough, it would create an environment in which our incoming principal would not be set up to succeed- in which case he would be forced to appoint someone else. It was not issued as a threat, just as a cause/effect reality.

My intent in communicating this information to you was so that the parents who seem most determined to reverse the principal appointment could know and understand that those efforts will not be successful, and that their energies would be better directed toward addressing their concerns with the process itself (i.e. advocating for consistency in hiring processes across the district, etc) and working with other CASs to strengthen our collective voices within the District.

It is barely 8 am and I've already gotten wind of a new rumor circulating that Starosky is threatening us. This is simply not true, and it's quite unfortunate that that is what's being communicated. As I said on the phone yesterday, the unrelenting paranoia about the district's ill intent toward us feels extremely toxic. As part of the district, it's impossible for me to see how fomenting an adversarial relationship there will ever work out well for us

Starosky will be sending out a letter to our community either today or tomorrow addressing the concerns that have been voiced. Please feel free to direct anyone with further questions to me. We need to be working with actual information, and not fear-based speculation. thanks,

Next steps:

- 1. Continue to strengthen and document the core components of Thornton Creek's program, including expeditionary learning, responsive classroom, and shared governance. We want to have our house in order so that we can show the new person, unequivocally, "here's how we do things."
- 2. Question the hiring process. We have reason to believe that district policies weren't followed and that other schools who are hiring principals had different and more opportunities to participate. When policies aren't followed, trust breaks down. We start to question why. We will collect the evidence about district policies, particularly for creative approach schools, and about the hiring process Bryant and Greenwood schools experienced. Then we will ask our District Relations Committee to reach out to the appropriate people at the district and, possibly, Jill Geary. We were going to ask Cassie from Communications to help gather folks, I think. Roger is also collecting information.
- 3. Request the new principal be trained in expeditionary learning and responsive classroom before he starts. The district chose a person who lacks experience in these critical areas. We need him to be trained.
- 4. Separate from these efforts to restore trust and get our needs met, we will plan to welcome our new principal into our community.
- 5. Separate from the parent-led effort, the staff on the interview committee are seeking a meeting with Mike (the supervisor of our ED) to discuss the process and their treatment during it.

Does that sound right?

I took some additional notes, for what they are worth. I am tired. Please overlook nonsense.

additional notes about parent feelings

The process was very quick and did not feel respectful. We did not have enough opportunity to provide input.

Hire is 31 years old (at most), no real teaching experience, inexperienced principal.

Messaging from the district felt like they didn't choose him for us.

New hire means he will be a "provisional hire" and will be scrutinized by and very beholden to the district. Are they trying to water down our program? Why?

-Helen has not spent more than 50 minutes at TC. She does not know the school. She did not do a walk through.

At Greenwood, the E.D. spent a day at Greenwood getting to know the school. He held a parent (and student!) meeting to discuss leadership needs, and met with staff. He made sure he really knew the community.

At Bryant, they were allowed to contribute questions to the process. Am trying to get more info on bryant process.

Based on evidence from SSD right now and Helen's history and line of questioning in particular, first way she is likely to push TC is for us to do the new CCC language arts curriculum with fidelity. This is being pushed back against district wide because - if you did it daily as it is written - it lacks rigor and is dull and repetetive. If we are forced to teach it with fidelity, all on the same lesson on the same day, we cannot continue to do expeditions. It would be impossible.

We also need administrative support to continue to waive the district's math curriculum. We arrived where we are now after extensive research, discussion, and lining up curriculum with our beliefs and with standards.

Per creative approach, we should be able to choose alternative curriculum. However, it requires an administrators support for evaluative and financial reasons. Having someone make us toe the district line is a real threat to the program.

Dear Thornton Creek Community,

Looking forward, we are beginning the process of selecting the next principal for Thornton Creek Elementary for the 2018 – 2019 school year. The principal selection process is a great opportunity for the whole community to revisit priorities, values and hopes as they participate in the selection of a new principal. This letter articulates Seattle Public Schools' hiring process for principals as well as the specific timeline for your school's hiring process.

The Seattle Public Schools Principal Hiring Process

The following are the guidelines Seattle Public Schools uses when hiring for a principal:

- The Superintendent has hiring authority at all times and may appoint or move a principal (or assistant principal) at any time.
- Per the Principals' Association Collective Bargaining Agreement, we consider the interest of principals and
 assistant principals for horizontal or vertical movement. The Chief of Schools reviews the requests and can make
 recommendations to the Superintendent if the person is a strong fit for the school.

- If the Superintendent does not make an appointment or approve a transfer, Human Resources posts the position to candidates in our principal leadership pool. Internal and external applicants apply to be in the principal pool starting in January. From there, the school's Executive Director of Schools works with the school's Building Leadership Team (BLT) to form a hiring team that screens applications, interviews candidates and recommends their top 2-3 candidates to the superintendent. The superintendent then makes the final decision. Hiring teams
 - Elementary School one primary teacher, one secondary teacher, two parents, one specialist (SPED, ELL, PE, Art, etc.), the administrative secretary or a classified representative, 1-2 school or central office administrators, and one to two executive directors. The total would be 9-10 members on the team.
 - Secondary School three core instruction teachers (or two core teachers and one specialist), three parents/guardians or community representatives, the administrative secretary or a classified representative, one instructional assistant, 1-2 school or central office administrators, and 1-2 executive directors. The total would be 11 or 12 members on a team.
- There are times where the Superintendent will recommend a candidate be hired with an "interim" status. This
 usually takes place when a position has not filled by a specific date, usually in mid to late August, or a position
 comes open after the student school year has started.

The Timeline for Hiring a Principal for Thornton Creek Elementary

We are moving to open hiring for Thornton Creek Elementary. The following is the approximate timeline:

- Mid-February: We will post the principal position for applicants who have been screened into the SPS principal pool.
- Late February/ Early March: Helen Joung, Executive Director of Schools, will work with the staff and community to determine desired characteristics of the new principal.
- Early March: Helen will work with the Building Leadership Team (BLT) to form a formal interview team made up of staff and families.
- Mid-March: The interview team will select candidates to interview, interview those candidates and then select 2-3 finalists. The superintendent will interview the finalists, make the final decision and announce the new principal to the community.

We are looking for parents who are interested in serving on the interview team who represent the diversity of our school community. If you are interested in being considered for the interview team, please contact **Alex Taylor** at abtaylor@seattleschools.org who will share your names with the Building Leadership Team.

After talking with Kristin yesterday, I think the only way out of this is for both of them to be out of leadership ASAP, which likely will have to be the end of this year, but could be immediately.

A group of us are beginning to think about how to proceed with a call for nominations for new site council leadership.

After talking with Kristin yesterday, I think the only way out of this is for both of them to be out of leadership ASAP, which likely will have to be the end of this year, but could be immediately.

I don't yet know how to do this without starting an all out war between those of us who see what trouble Christina is causing and those who think she's cherry pie and is the victim in this situation "having been through a lot". We really cannot accuse her of the things we believe to be true.

I see a few possibilities:

- 1) We ask Kristin and/or John to request that they step down, either immediately or at the end of the year. Citing irreconcilable differences with teachers and in light of accusations she has made (Christina). Seems reasonable since Evan has refused multiple opportunities to meet and talk, the most recent one being today with LC. Someone is appointed interim chair and vice chair and we hold elections. I think Lissa A would step in as interim as would I happily but that might not be copacetic, Not sure.
- 2) We have the BLT make the same request for the same reasons.
- 3) What else could we do? I don't think parents can do this.

Hi everyone,

First off, I want to address the dividing-the-community worry and my concern about the potential for rumors and misinformation.

I think several of us involved, in our worry and passion and stress, have dropped bits of things we probably should not have, and those seem to develop a life of their own. So, I think it is hugely important to focus on the shared community interests in this, and the things parents can best affect.

Though there are numerous red flags around the possible actions of a small number of parents, I don't think this issue is worth calling out. Let staff do that in our complaint against the Exec Director, because it really isn't about any one parent - you are all entitled to believe whatever you want about this place, and we all deal with parents who don't like what we do. That's fine. The parent part of this is all about inappropriate boundaries with those parents on the part of administration. And that's an issue for staff with administration. You don't need to go there. What those parents thought about the candidates is all confidential so there is no need to worry or ask. And for some parents, any perception that a few people are being singled out is going to turn them off and increase division. Just focus on what the majority want to do right now.

As far as site council leadership goes, if there is change afoot there, that's pretty basic. As per the bylaws, I believe, that position rotates every year; another slate or two can simply step up. There is even a provision for voting. Just say "Hey, we'd like to take this on next!" I would not touch that now, just put it on the agenda in May so there can be a vote in June.

The following are the issues staff are bringing to Mike Starosky next week that would also be a good focus for parents. Hopefully these are things you can all get behind.

Shortened Timeline:

Summary: We were provided 9 days to complete a 4 week process. This was inadequate to insure community input in the principal hiring process.

2/14/18 John's request to appoint Kristin denied

2/16/18 BLT asked district for hiring timeline

3/9/18 community letter about hiring process received. It describes a timeline that would have started 3-4 weeks prior. ***This is the letter that was different for Bryant.

3/12/18 Helen Joung meets with BLT and site council leadership. This is where we receive information to begin the process of collecting community input and naming a hiring committee.

3/13/18 Site Council information session

3/15/18 Site Council parent meeting with Helen

3/21/18 Parent look-for surveys due, all look-fors due to Helen's office

3/24/18 Interviews

Summary: Community input was not used as described in this meeting

We were told by Helen Joung:

- All the principal candidates in the pool have met strict district criteria and made it this far in the process. They are all acceptable candidates. The interview process is to determine the best candidate for Thornton Creek.
- You need to tell your parents to stop contacting us.
- They will use our look-fors from the site council meeting, the staff look-fors, and a synopsis of the parent survey data to guide decision-making.

Alternative School Board Policy 54.00 and failure to consider community input

Summary:

The community was told that principal postings do not require community/staff/family input as it is a general advertisement for a required skill set and certifications of a School Leader, contradicting this board policy.

Community was not allowed to contribute school-specific questions to the interview.

Community input does not appear to have been considered in the selection of this candidate.

Two things that parents can bring forward, and staff cannot -

1. The qualifications of the new principal, particularly when appointing our own experienced a.p. was an option. The rationale provided by Mike Starosky in his letter to the community, and what the community has been able to gather from publicly available info about the new principal, do not line up at all with community needs. The facts do not match what the district has said about how this is the best candidate.

You can cite your particular concerns about Thornton Creek's needs - whatever you actually believe. Special ed continuum experience, the ability to grow an alternative program, leadership, coaching and guidance to a staff of largely experienced teachers, etc. Shared decision making with an active parent community. Managing a school with a huge staff, 2 assistant principals and nearly 600 kids.

2. Concerns based on district history about whether this is intended as a way to dismantle or alter the program

What should you ask for?

That's up to you. You are parents, you can ask for what you want. You can ask for them to reconsider this appointment. You can ask them to justify the choice. You can ask for Kristin, given the level of confidence in their supposedly neutral interview process. You can focus on shared community values; you can focus on Board Policy 54.00 and how this process has not been aligned with that.

Meanwhile, back at the ranch, this is what the 5 staff interview team people will also be addressing. **DO NOT TOUCH ON ANY OF THIS.** I mention it only because you've heard bits and pieces of this but should not be a parent issue. And if it is brought it up by others, just say that cannot be confirmed and move on.

- · Atmosphere of intimidation throughout the process
- Interview-specific failure to incorporate community input or needs of TC
- Interview-specific facilitation and time issues
- Inappropriate contact with select parent(s) by ED and the solicitation of misinformation
- False, baseless, unsupported accusations against staff interview team by ED

So far we have 31 responses.

I am definitely starting to worry a bit about dividing our community. The parents of EEPPA class use the Bloomz social platform to communicate with the teacher and each other. There was quite a bit of back and forth on this issue yesterday, and our room parent, who was at Site Council last week, sent out a long email to the group suggesting that questioning the new principal was "not kind." (Ouch!) There's a perception that we are also negating the hard work of the two parents on the committee. And there was an argument that we would not be questioning the process if Kristin had been selected.

I am envious of these parents' optimism and trust in the District. I remember when I used to assume the best. :(

I reached out to a friend at Salmon Bay who described the changes that took place after the new principal arrived. Apparently he had a questionable track record (some lawsuit from an employee at another school). Came in and got rid of Mary Kay because she doesn't have the kind of teaching credential she needs to be alone with the kiddos. The teacher has to stay. Mary Kay was a huge part of their program: for years, she had been leading "Friday morning sings," where parents often stayed to sing with the kids as a community. Also, without warning or discussion, he eliminated looping. So....these kind of things do happen. Salmon Bay does not have the shared leadership and Site Council model we have.

We need to get hold of the Bryant timeline and materials and the Greenwood timeline and materials.

Next steps:

- 1. Continue to strengthen and document the core components of Thornton Creek's program, including expeditionary learning, responsive classroom, and shared governance. We want to have our house in order so that we can show the new person, unequivocally, "here's how we do things."
- 2. Question the hiring process. We have reason to believe that district policies weren't followed and that other schools who are hiring principals had different and more opportunities to participate. When policies aren't followed, trust breaks down. We start to question why. We will collect the evidence about district policies, particularly for creative approach schools, and about

the hiring process **Bryant** and Greenwood schools experienced. Then we will ask our **District Relations** Committee to reach out to the appropriate people at the district and, possibly, Jill Geary. We were going to ask Cassie from Communications to help gather folks, I think. Roger is also collecting information.

- 3. Request the new principal be trained in expeditionary learning and responsive classroom before he starts. The district chose a person who lacks experience in these critical areas. We need him to be trained.
- 4. Separate from these efforts to restore trust and get our needs met, we will plan to welcome our new principal into our community.
- 5. Separate from the parent-led

effort, the staff on the interview committee are seeking a meeting with Mike (the supervisor of our ED) to discuss the process and their treatment during it.

Does that sound right?

I took some additional notes, for what they are worth. I am tired. Please overlook nonsense.

additional notes about parent feelings

The process was very quick and did not feel respectful. We did not have enough opportunity to provide input.

Hire is 31 years old (at most), no real teaching experience, inexperienced principal.

Messaging from the district felt like they didn't choose him for us.

New hire means he will be a "provisional hire" and will be scrutinized by and very beholden to the district. Are they trying to water down our program? Why?

There is even a provision for voting. Just say "Hey, we'd like to take this on next!" I would not touch that now, just put it on the agenda in May so there can be a vote in June.

So far we have 31 responses.

I am definitely starting to worry a bit about dividing our community. The parents of ERPA class use the Bloomz social platform to communicate with the teacher and each other. There was quite a bit of back and forth on this issue yesterday, and our room parent, who was at Site Council last week, sent out a long email to the group suggesting that questioning the new principal was "not kind." (Ouch!) There's a perception that we are also negating the hard work of the two parents on the committee. And there was an argument that we would not be questioning the process if Kristin had been selected.

I am envious of these parents' optimism and trust in the District. I remember when I used to assume the best. :(

Alternative School Board Policy 54.00 and failure to consider community input

Summary:

The community was told that principal postings do not require community/staff/family input as it is a general advertisement for a required skill set and certifications of a School Leader, contradicting this board policy.

Community was not allowed to contribute school-specific questions to the interview.

Community input does not appear to have been considered in the selection of this candidate.

Two things that parents can bring forward, and staff cannot -

1. The qualifications of the new principal, particularly when appointing our own experienced a.p. was an option. The rationale provided by Mike Starosky in his letter to the community, and what the community has been able to gather from publicly available info about the new principal, do not line up at all with community needs. The facts do not match what the district has said about how this is the best candidate.

You can cite your particular concerns about Thornton Creek's needs - whatever you actually believe. Special ed continuum experience, the ability to grow an alternative program, leadership, coaching and guidance to a staff of largely experienced teachers, etc. Shared decision making with an active parent community. Managing a school with a huge staff, 2 assistant principals and nearly 600 kids.

2. Concerns based on district history about whether this is intended as a way to dismantle or alter the program

What should you ask for?

That's up to you. You are parents, you can ask for what you want. You can ask for them to reconsider this appointment. You can ask them to justify the choice. You can ask for Kristin, given the level of confidence in their supposedly neutral interview process. You can focus on shared community values; you can focus on Board Policy 54.00 and how this process has not been aligned with that.

Meanwhile, back at the ranch, this is what the 5 staff interview team people will also be addressing. **DO NOT TOUCH ON ANY OF THIS.** I mention it only because you've heard bits and pieces of this but should not be a parent issue. And if it is brought it up by others, just say that cannot be confirmed and move on.

- Atmosphere of intimidation throughout the process
- · Interview-specific failure to incorporate community input or needs of TC
- · Interview-specific facilitation and time issues
- Inappropriate contact with select parent(s) by ED and the solicitation of misinformation
- False, baseless, unsupported accusations against staff interview team by ED

Hi all,

So far we have 31 responses.

I am definitely starting to worry a bit about dividing our community. The parents of class use the Bloomz social platform to communicate with the teacher and each other. There was quite a bit of back and forth on this issue yesterday, and our room parent, who was at Site Council last week, sent out a long email to the group suggesting that questioning the new principal was "not kind." (Ouch!) There's a perception that we are also negating the hard work of the two parents on the committee. And there was an argument that we would not be questioning the process if Kristin had been selected.

I am envious of these parents' optimism and trust in the District. I remember when I used to assume the best. :(

I reached out to a friend at Salmon Bay who described the changes that took place after the new principal arrived. Apparently he had a questionable track record (some lawsuit from an employee at another school). Came in and got rid of Mary Kay because she doesn't have the kind of teaching credential she needs to be alone with the kiddos. The teacher has to stay. Mary Kay was a huge part of their program: for years, she had been leading "Friday morning sings," where parents often stayed to sing with the kids as a community. Also, without warning or discussion, he eliminated looping. So....these kind of things do happen. Salmon Bay does not have the shared leadership and Site Council model we have.

We need to get hold of the Bryant timeline and materials and the Greenwood timeline and materials.

-Form challenge could take: removing our ability to be flexible with curriculum, such as the new reading/writing curriculum or teaching every science unit in the correct grade - expeditionary learning requires that we often integrate those subjects into our expeditionary work, and that we may cover fewer topics on the surface opting to dig deeper into what we do do. A new principal, under pressure from the district, could challenge camp, field trips, recess minutes, looping -- there are things the principal has oversight of that are presently subject to shared decision making.

Dear Thornton Creek Community,

Looking forward, we are beginning the process of selecting the next principal for Thornton Creek Elementary for the 2018 – 2019 school year. The principal selection process is a great opportunity for the whole community to revisit priorities, values and hopes as they participate in the selection of a new principal. This letter articulates Seattle Public Schools' hiring process for principals as well as the specific timeline for your school's hiring process.

The Seattle Public Schools Principal Hiring Process

The following are the guidelines Seattle Public Schools uses when hiring for a principal:

- The Superintendent has hiring authority at all times and may appoint or move a principal (or assistant principal) at any time.
- Per the Principals' Association Collective Bargaining Agreement, we consider the interest
 of principals and assistant principals for horizontal or vertical movement. The Chief of
 Schools reviews the requests and can make recommendations to the Superintendent if
 the person is a strong fit for the school.
- If the Superintendent does not make an appointment or approve a transfer, Human Resources posts the position to candidates in our principal leadership pool. Internal and external applicants apply to be in the principal pool starting in January. From there, the school's Executive Director of Schools works with the school's Building Leadership Team (BLT) to form a hiring team that screens applications, interviews candidates and recommends their top 2-3 candidates to the superintendent. The superintendent then makes the final decision. Hiring teams typically consist of the following:
 - Elementary School one primary teacher, one secondary teacher, two parents, one specialist (SPED, ELL, PE, Art, etc.), the administrative

- secretary or a classified representative, 1-2 school or central office administrators, and one to two executive directors. The total would be 9-10 members on the team.
- Secondary School three core instruction teachers (or two core teachers and one specialist), three parents/guardians or community representatives, the administrative secretary or a classified representative, one instructional assistant, 1-2 school or central office administrators, and 1-2 executive directors. The total would be 11 or 12 members on a team.
- There are times where the Superintendent will recommend a candidate be hired with an
 "interim" status. This usually takes place when a position has not filled by a specific date,
 usually in mid to late August, or a position comes open after the student school year has
 started.

The Timeline for Hiring a Principal for Thornton Creek Elementary

We are moving to open hiring for Thornton Creek Elementary. The following is the approximate timeline:

- Mid-February: We will post the principal position for applicants who have been screened into the SPS principal pool.
- Late February/ Early March: Helen Joung, Executive Director of Schools, will work with the staff and community to determine desired characteristics of the new principal.
- Early March: Helen will work with the Building Leadership Team (BLT) to form a formal interview team made up of staff and families.
- Mid-March: The interview team will select candidates to interview, interview those candidates
 and then select 2-3 finalists. The superintendent will interview the finalists, make the final
 decision and announce the new principal to the community.

We are looking for parents who are interested in serving on the interview team who represent the diversity of our school community. Again after further conversations -

-Helen has not spent more than 50 minutes at TC. She does not know the school. She did not do a walk through.

At Greenwood, the E.D. spent a day at Greenwood getting to know the school. He held a parent (and student!) meeting to discuss leadership needs, and met with staff. He made sure he really knew the community.

At Bryant, they were allowed to contribute questions to the process. Am trying to get more info on bryant process.

Based on evidence from SSD right now and Helen's history and line of questioning in particular, first way she is likely to push TC is for us to do the new CCC language arts curriculum with fidelity. This is being pushed back against district wide because - if you did it daily as it is written - it lacks rigor and is dull and repetetive. If we are forced to teach it with fidelity, all on the same lesson on the same day, we cannot continue to do expeditions. It would be impossible.

We also need administrative support to continue to waive the district's math curriculum. We arrived where we are now after extensive research, discussion, and lining up curriculum with our beliefs and with standards.

Per creative approach, we should be able to choose alternative curriculum. However, it requires an administrators support for evaluative and financial reasons. Having someone make us toe the district line is a real threat to the program.

Some news...

Evan texted me today and asked to meet with me to talk about a phone call she got from Mike Starosky. I wasn't able to meet up but we did have a 30 min conversation. I believe the intent was for me to share this information so I don't think I'm violating any confidences by sharing this.

Starosky was explicit in his message that in no uncertain terms would Kristin be our principal and if we (parents, I guess) continue to go down that path that our school would be deemed a hostile environment for Jonathan and they would pull him out and install someone else.

We then talked at length about the situation in our school. I said I was under the impression that she was ready to welcome the new principal and wanted to move on beyond any pushback. She said that was not true and that she supported us asking questions of the district about the process.

She also said she'd told Starosky that parents are afraid this is an effort to dismantle our program and that was in part because he hadn't communicated sufficiently with us. He said "we are not that organized" ...so basically the notion is ridiculous.

I'm sharing this because I don't know what to do with the information from Starosky. It seems like blatant intimidation and threats. I told Evan it was highly unusual for the site council chair to be communicating with the district. She agreed.

Either he's serious and we should stop or he's bluffing because he knows we are on to something. The message was clear though, if they install someone else, it won't be in our best interest.

I don't know where to go from here.

On a different but related note, I think an effort needs to be made to meet with Evan and talk things through. Every time I have a conversation with her I get the feelings she's stuck in the middle of a really big mess. I don't know what my feelings are about Christina. But I think there is a lot of misunderstanding flying around. Evan asked why I was in the middle of all this and I suggested she reach out to all of you so I wouldn't need to be.

I'm happy to talk with any of you. Just give me a call.

I have been a lot of places about this tonight.

- 1. Quit. Give up.
- 2. `Hmm. Just keep going, like we originally said, because it is a reasonable request.
- 3. What on earth is he so afraid of? We have to keep pushing because this is really, really odd. And my significant other agrees super strange behavior. There is nothing unusual about the parent reaction here, especially since no one has done anything except be concerned and ask perfectly reasonable questions.

I think it is quite logical for parents to take this communication to Jill Geary. Given the well-documented rational staff concerns about the process, and the reasonable questions of parents given Mike's description of the candidate and his resume, it is unreasonable for him to threaten parents to just be quiet. The meeting they had was private, intended to share information

I do think we have to bridge to Evan. Here is the thing: we kept parents, most all parents, completely out of the loop until the announcement was made. And they raised their own questions pretty quickly post-announcement. What has been confusing about Evan is that she has had multiple private interactions with Helen - is this just because she didn't know what we were going through with Helen?

I guess we have to just ask her that.

The question about what to do about the clear constant spilling all kinds of stuff back to Helen and Mike, and where that is coming form, is an ongoing concern. It has poisoned our initial ethical, reasonable intent in questioning the process. This is a pretty toxic community issue.

I love what Maria said. I agree completely.

- We have not reached out to the ombudsman yet. Our goal for three weeks has been to meet with Mike Starosky.
- What Lisa said, "it is unreasonable for him to threaten parents to just be quiet..." Not only is it unreasonable—it is WRONG for him to threaten parents for speaking up, for simply having a discussion!
- Evan: let's ask her about her interactions with Helen. And let her know that we have been working for a meeting for over three weeks. But we must continue to maintain our confidentiality, at least until our meeting. I'm feeling so burned, as Lisa says, by an individual who appears to be sharing information with the ED. I don't know what the relationship between Evan and that individual is.
- Thought: publish to FB (via Evan) what the Chief of Schools said... see how the reactions go.
- . Meet with Jill Geary about being threatened this way. This is a must. This behavior cannot go unreported on.

This entire "process" is a joke. Our school and individuals working for the public school in good faith and with many years of service have been treated unfairly and in a demeaning way.

I was personally encouraged by what Mike Starosky said! Now this is blatantly out in the open and can be reported to the school board. What it means to me is that parents and staff ARE making a difference in trying to look closely at why our process was so unfairly conducted.

It is not clear to anyone why it must NOT be Kristin. I think that there is clear bias AGAINST her in this process, exhibited by the behavior of the ED on many occasions. We don't know the reason for that.

Mike Starosky doing this, making this threat, as our SEA uniserve rep said, indicates that he is feeling pressure. To me that's good.

Remember, Starosky has not spoken to ANY of the staff members who were on the interview committee. He can only be getting his information via one source, the ED (and from perhaps one parent who seems to have her ear). This is a huge error on his part. And I wonder if now he is realizing that he has not shown a good faith effort to meet with staff about their issues and it is getting out of hand.

I really feel this is about right and wrong. Mr. Starosky should have agreed to meet with us three weeks ago when we first asked him to discuss our concerns about the process. I suspect he is taking his direction and information solely from the

ED. In what world does a Chief of Schools (two levels up from our principal) CALL the Site Council/PTA Chair and tell her to "call off the parents?" And then threaten us? Definitely this needs to be daylighted.

Another possibility: MS actually wants parents to keep pushing? I mean, who would respond with a meek, ok we'll stop.

I would think that this would convince individuals on the fence to question the whole thing, too? As a parent, I'm thinking, wait, he's threatening me for speaking up as a parent? Not okay! One might try just posting exactly what he said on the FB page and see how people react! Maybe to Save Seattle Schools too... how would our entire parent community feel about this? It could happen to them too!

My personal reaction was—you want to place someone in our "hostile environment?" Go ahead! What have we got to lose? The person put forward, who is probably a lovely person etc.—I have no idea—just doesn't meet the qualifications of what our nearly 600-seat creative approach/EL school with 23% IEP was looking for. I'm sure there is dead weight out there in the district that they could transfer to us, or worse, but at least we are daylighting to the entire community that they are not following their own policies and procedures. Were I a young teacher or administrator, I would avoid SPS like the plague if this is the way that their hiring process works.

Hi Stacy,

I appreciate the follow up and I think we need to be really clear about what was and wasn't said. At no point did Starosky threaten anyone. He said nothing about preventing parents from expressing concerns/feedback about the actual process. Folks are more than welcome to share their thoughts about that and absolutely have that right. There is a lot of talk about this being about the process and not specifically about Jonathan, but then the conversation keeps returning to Jonathan himself and the desire to overturn the appointment. I heard one parent at the meeting Sunday night (and also a Fb comment to the same effect) suggest that continuing to inundate the Superintendent's office with demands to overturn the appointment and install Kristin might succeed, and I felt it important to convey that this is not the case. Starosky was clear that under no circumstances would Kristin be principal of our school, and that if Nyland felt the resistance to this was persistent enough, it would create an environment in which our incoming principal would not be set up to succeed- in which case he would be forced to appoint someone else. It was not issued as a threat, just as a cause/effect reality.

My intent in communicating this information to you was so that the parents who seem most determined to reverse the principal appointment could know and understand that those efforts will not be successful, and that their energies would be better directed toward addressing their concerns with the process itself (i.e. advocating for consistency in hiring processes across the district, etc) and working with other CASs to strengthen our collective voices within the District.

It is barely 8 am and I've already gotten wind of a new rumor circulating that Starosky is threatening us. This is simply not true, and it's quite unfortunate that that is what's being communicated. As I said on the phone yesterday, the unrelenting paranoia about the district's ill intent toward us feels extremely toxic. As part of

the district, it's impossible for me to see how fomenting an adversarial relationship there will ever work out well for us.

Starosky will be sending out a letter to our community either today or tomorrow addressing the concerns that have been voiced. Please feel free to direct anyone with further questions to me. We need to be working with actual information, and not fear-based speculation. thanks,

This move by Starosky sure seems like intimidation and threats. As I mentioned, even the most upset parents have voiced that they will welcome Jonathan if and when he comes to our school and that this is not about them. He's basically threatening parents who are questioning an unusual process - something that seems well within our rights.

Hi.

A group of us are beginning to think about how to proceed with a call for nominations for new site council leadership. After talking with Kristin yesterday, I think the only way out of this is for both of them to be out of leadership ASAP, which likely will have to be the end of this year, but could be immediately.

How can we mend fences when everything is still just a big white elephant in the room?

Why has Evan still refused to meet with teachers? Let me add that I talked with Evan for a long time last night. Not about site council, just about life. I really do like her so this is not personal in any way. I just still firmly believe that she cannot continue in this role and we certainly can't have C continue. I have less warm fuzzies with regard to her and what seems to be ongoing information leaking to Helen.

As far as the question of what can teachers do to support parents who are advocating moving on with a new slate... good question. I think the best thing any of us can do right now is be honest. We need to stop dancing around the issues and we need to discuss them. We don't have to do it in an unkind way but we must address the elephant which is all the bad feelings between teachers and the current chair/vice. The parents who think they should go feel that way because of how the teachers feel. We are supporting you and what you want. We agree with you but if you were telling us they were fabulous, we wouldn't be trying to stage a coup!!!

No maybe not the right term then.

Just reading the PASS contract. For the first three years, "New School Leaders" are evaluated on a comprehensive (more thorough, more areas) cycle. After that, experienced leaders only have a comprehensive evaluation every four years. A new school leader who is not "fully proficient" at the end of year 3 can be non-renewed. The process for non-renewal is more complex after that. Kristin is already in her sixth year as a "school leader" so she is not as vulnerable.

One more thing, after our conversation today -- ALL confidentiality rules regarding the actual interview of candidates remain in place. I can't talk about any of what happened in the interview to you. (But we can to the higher-ups we will be meeting with. I can't tell you if we voted or what we think about that. I can't tell you what we asked or what we discussed. But Mike's letter about why this guy is the right one for TC speaks for itself in terms of not relating in any way to our look-fors.

However, I can tell you that after we asked for a meeting to discuss the process, Helen publicly accused the five of us of breaching confidentiality and somehow using this information to retaliate against children; she provided no evidence for this, none whatsoever. She suggested that we had tried to plot to have Kristin appointed and had responded with this behavior when we were unsuccessful.

Throughout the meeting where we were presenting our concerns she rolled her eyes, whispered to her neighbor, giggled and was generally inappropriate. She also yelled at us and at our union representative to try and get us to not begin the meeting with our concerns. She was shockingly unprofessional. We have grave concerns about her making decisions about our program.

Again after further conversations -

-Helen has not spent more than 50 minutes at TC. She does not know the school. She did not do a walk through.

At Greenwood, the E.D. spent a day at Greenwood getting to know the school. He held a parent (and student!) meeting to discuss leadership needs, and met with staff. He made sure he really knew the community.

At Bryant, they were allowed to contribute questions to the process. Am trying to get more info on bryant process.

Based on evidence from SSD right now and Helen's history and line of questioning in particular, first way she is likely to push TC is for us to do the new CCC language arts curriculum with fidelity. This is being pushed back against district wide because - if you did it daily as it is written - it lacks rigor and is dull and repetetive. If we are forced to teach it with fidelity, all on the same lesson on the same day, we cannot continue to do expeditions. It would be impossible.

We also need administrative support to continue to waive the district's math curriculum. We arrived where we are now after extensive research, discussion, and lining up curriculum with our beliefs and with standards.

Per creative approach, we should be able to choose alternative curriculum. However, it requires an administrators support for evaluative and financial reasons. Having someone make us toe the district line is a real threat to the program.

Subject: Thornton Creek leadership hiring process

Dear Thornton Creek Community,

Looking forward, we are beginning the process of selecting the next principal for Thornton Creek Elementary for the 2018 – 2019 school year. The principal selection process is a great opportunity for the whole community to revisit priorities, values and hopes as they participate in the selection of a new principal. This letter articulates Seattle Public Schools' hiring process for principals as well as the specific timeline for your school's hiring process.

The Seattle Public Schools Principal Hiring Process

The following are the guidelines Seattle Public Schools uses when hiring for a principal:

- The Superintendent has hiring authority at all times and may appoint or move a principal (or assistant principal) at any time.
- Per the Principals' Association Collective Bargaining Agreement, we consider the interest of principals and assistant principals for horizontal or vertical movement. The Chief of Schools reviews the requests and can make recommendations to the Superintendent if the person is a strong fit for the school.
- If the Superintendent does not make an appointment or approve a transfer, Human Resources posts the position to candidates in our principal leadership pool. Internal and external applicants apply to be in the principal pool starting in January. From there, the school's Executive Director of Schools works with the school's Building Leadership Team (BLT) to form a hiring team that screens applications, interviews candidates and recommends their top 2-3 candidates to the superintendent. The superintendent then makes the final decision. Hiring teams typically consist of the following:
 - Elementary School one primary teacher, one secondary teacher, two parents, one specialist (SPED, ELL, PE, Art, etc.), the administrative secretary or a classified representative, 1-2 school or central office administrators, and one to two executive directors. The total would be 9-10 members on the team.
 - Secondary School three core instruction teachers (or two core teachers and one specialist), three parents/guardians or community representatives, the administrative secretary or a classified representative, one instructional assistant, 1-2 school or central office administrators, and 1-2 executive directors. The total would be 11 or 12 members on a team.
- There are times where the Superintendent will recommend a candidate be

hired with an "interim" status. This usually takes place when a position has not filled by a specific date, usually in mid to late August, or a position comes open after the student school year has started.

The Timeline for Hiring a Principal for Thornton Creek Elementary
We are moving to open hiring for Thornton Creek Elementary. The following is the approximate timeline:

- Mid-February: We will post the principal position for applicants who have been screened into the SPS principal pool.
- Late February/ Early March: Helen Joung, Executive Director of Schools, will work with the staff and community to determine desired characteristics of the new principal.
- Early March: Helen will work with the Building Leadership Team (BLT) to form a formal interview team made up of staff and families.
- Mid-March: The interview team will select candidates to interview, interview those candidates and then select 2-3 finalists. The superintendent will interview the finalists, make the final decision and announce the new principal to the community.

We are looking for parents who are interested in serving on the interview team who represent the diversity of our school community. I'm the Chair of Thornton Creek's Site Council, and I'm becoming overwhelmed with the situation at our school surrounding the selection of our new principal. As I'm sure you are aware to some extent, this process has been fraught since the start and has escalated to a point that feels truly destructive to our community.

Our staff are extremely distrustful of the district at this point, and that fear is now infecting the parent population as well. I've done my best to be a voice of reason throughout this ordeal, but I feel we've finally reached a critical tipping point and I am genuinely at a loss for how best to proceed given the climate of fear and paranoia that's overtaken our school.

If possible I would like to schedule a time to meet with you, ideally early next week, so that I can share a bit about how this situation is playing out on the ground. We need some serious guidance and intervention.
